

## STUDENTS HAVE RIGHTS: DISABILITIES & DISTANCE LEARNING

- Students with disabilities are entitled to all the supports and services they need to make progress in school - whether they are in person or participating in distance learning.
- School districts are still required to implement a student's IEP, even if the student is learning from home.
- Students with disabilities cannot be disciplined for conduct that relates to their disabilities.
- If a student's behavior is interfering with their learning, school districts may have to provide evaluations, supports, and services to help address those behaviors.
- Parents may request that their child be evaluated for special education services at any time, even
  if their student is not attending school in person. The school must conduct the evaluation at no
  cost to the parent.
- Parents/guardians can request meetings with the school if they have concerns about their student's 504 plan/IEP, or how is is being implemented in the distance learning setting.
